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
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EDITORIAL

In this first issue of our Newsletter in 1989, the new Executive Board would like to thank all of you that with interest, enthusiasm, participation and work have contributed to get our Association into function. Since the seeds were sown in Japan in 1985, EAHIL has grown to an association with some 500 members from 25 European and overseas countries thanks to the dedication of many of our members and thanks to the interest in our Association.

Much has been accomplished, but still we have a lot of work to do. We need to activate resources we have among our members.

In order to carry on a meaningful programme, it has been decided to set up several committees, and we now call for members who are willing to do a job for EAHIL (see EAHIL Programme of Activities).

The new Board has started to bridge the distances between countries like Norway and Italy. All its members met on February 26 in Paris and are preparing the meeting of our Council and of the members of our Association present at the IFLA Conference in August 1989 in Paris as well as of our General Assembly and of our Workshop on 7-8 May 1990 before the First European Conference for Library Automation and Networking from 9-11 May 1990 in Brussels.

Our project of Directory of Health Libraries in Europe is underway and we hope that your answers to the questionnaire attached will enable us to publish it very soon.

The Board has handed to the CEC a synthesis of the comments made in Bologna about its draft Plan of Action for Libraries and is publishing this synthesis in this Newsletter. The CEC is organizing on 7-8 March in Luxembourg a "Forum discussion" of this Action Plan by representatives of national and European library organizations. Our Board will keep EAHIL members aware about the implementation of this Action Plan and we will promote the participation of health libraries in this plan.

EDITORIAL

A l'occasion du premier numéro de notre Bulletin d'Information en 1989, le nouveau Bureau Exécutif tient à remercier vivement tous ceux qui avec intérêt, enthousiasme, coopération et travail ont contribué à la réalisation de l'Association. Depuis les premières semences germées au Japon en 1985, l'AEIBS n'a pas cessé de s'agrandir et compte à ce jour quelque 500 membres de 25 pays européens et d'outremer, grâce au travail de beaucoup de nos membres et à l'intérêt porté à l'Association.

Beaucoup a déjà été réalisé, il reste cependant encore un important travail à faire. Il nous est nécessaire à cet effet de puiser dans les ressources de nos membres.

Afin d'accomplir un programme significatif, il a été décidé de créer plusieurs comités et ici nous faisons appel aux membres qui sont prêts à consacré un peu de leur temps à l'Association (voir Programme et activités de l'AEIBS).

Le nouveau Bureau a déjà commencé à renforcer la coopération entre des pays européens aussi différents et éloignés que la Norvège et l'Italie. Il s'est réuni au complet à Paris le 26 février et il prépare les réunions de notre Conseil et des membres de l'Association présents à la Conférence de l'IFLA en août 1989 à Paris ainsi que de notre Assemblée Générale et du "Workshop" de notre Association les 7-8 mai 1990 avant la Première Conférence Européenne pour l'Automatisation et les Réseaux de Bibliothèques du 9-11 mai 1990 à Bruxelles.

Notre projet de Répertoire des Bibliothèques de Santé Européennes est en préparation et nous espérons que vos réponses au questionnaire ci-joint nous permettront de le publier prochainement.

Le Bureau a transmis à la CCE une synthèse des réactions formulées à Bologne concernant leur projet de Plan d'Action et la publie dans ce Bulletin. La CCE organise à Luxembourg, les 7-8 mars, une consultation de représentants d'organisations nationales et européennes de bibliothèques concernant son plan d'action. Notre Bureau tiendra les membres de l'Association européenne

Finally, an informative newsletter or journal is extremely important for efficient communication. It is of great importance to make this product interesting for all of our members. The EAHIL Newsletter is the results of spontaneous contributions from colleagues of various countries and we urge you to send all articles of interest to our secretariat in Brussels. We hope that you all will cooperate in contributing actively to make our Newsletter an efficient instrument of communication to all of us.

NEWS FROM OUR ASSOCIATION

MINUTES OF THE EAHIL GENERAL ASSEMBLY MEETING HELD IN BOLOGNA ON NOVEMBER 3, 1988

Mr M. Walckiers, President, opened the Meeting at 5:00 pm.

1. The minutes of the inaugural Meeting in Brighton, UK, on August 1987 were approved.
2. The President introduced the Activity Report of EAHIL Executive Board for 1987 and 1988, which was approved by all members except Dr Cichi who protested against a possible exclusion of papers from the Proceedings by the Programme Committee of the Bologna Conference. The President replied that the Proceedings will include all papers received by the deadline, but some papers may be reduced in length if needed.
3. The Financial Report for 1987 was presented by the Treasurer. This was approved.
4. Mr Van Hoek, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, reported on the results of the elections of the Council and the Nominating Committee.

Mr Walckiers handed over the chair of the Meeting to Mrs Comba, the new President.

5. Mrs Comba welcomed to the platform the newly elected members of the Executive Board. Apologies had been received from Mrs Pailley-Katz, who was unable to be present. Mrs Comba then asked the new Executive Board to present themselves. They are: Monique Cleland, Ursula Hausen, Tony King, Ragnhild Lande, Arlette Pailley-Katz, Marc Walckiers (Past Present).
Mrs Comba also thanked all her Italian colleagues, especially Gabriella Poppi.
6. The new President presented the Programme of Work. She asked for comments and suggestions for priorities.
7. The new President proposed the draft Budget and fees for 1989, and this was approved by the Meeting.
8. The Rules of Procedure were introduced by Ursula Hausen. Dr Adamic suggested the deadline for payment of fees should be extended. The President proposed, and David Stewart seconded that the deadline should be extended to 30 April and the Meeting agreed.
Susan Bakker, Amsterdam, requested the fees could be paid by postal check. The Past President said it was more difficult to open a postal account than a bank account, but that it will be done very soon.
Peter Morgan said the document was too complicated and distributed too late. He proposed that under Art. 2, Section 2, the sentence "If a country has a professional association, the list shall be sent to that association only" should be deleted. This was seconded by Fiona Picken, and approved by the Meeting.
Ursula Hausen proposed the following addition to the same article: "The newly elected Executive Board will take office on January 1 of the year following the election". This was seconded by Susan Bakker, and approved by the Meeting.
9. The new President presented the letter from Mrs Colaianni concerning the possible postponement of the 1990 Conference because of the conflict with the Sixth International Congress in New Dehli, September 1990. The Meeting was in favour of a Meeting in 1990, and the President agreed to consult members about this.
Mr Friend, Great Britain, said he was disappointed that there is no close links between LIBER and our Association, and suggested that the Executive Board discuss formal links with LIBER to the mutual benefit of both associations. Mr King proposed a vote of thanks to the outgoing members of the Board.

The Meeting adjourned at 6:30 pm.

Our Association - CALL FOR LOGOS



CEC

On July 28, 1988 the Commission of the European Communities (DG XIII) invited the Association to communicate its comments and suggestions about the CEC draft Plan of Action for Libraries.

The full CEC summary of this Plan of Action has been published in English and in French in the September issue of our Newsletter.

At our Second European Conference of Medical Libraries held in Bologna on November 4-6, 1988, Mr Parajon-Collada, Deputy Director General of the CEC, presented this Plan of Action and answered to the questions and comments of our colleagues from different European countries.

Finally, after a last dialogue between the above colleagues and the EAHIL Executive Board, the Association's answer, published hereafter, has been sent to the CEC on January 17, 1989.

Let's hope that the EAHIL suggestions will contribute to the successful implementation of this first Plan of Action for Libraries in Europe and that the health and medical libraries will be able to fully participate in this cooperation between European libraries.

CCE

Le 28 juillet 1988, notre Association a été invitée par la Commission des Communautés Européennes (DG XIII) à présenter des remarques et suggestions sur son projet de plan d'action pour les bibliothèques de la Communauté Européenne.

Le résumé de ce plan d'action de la CCE a été publié intégralement en anglais et en français dans notre Bulletin d'Information de septembre 1988.

Lors de notre Deuxième Conférence des bibliothèques Médicales tenue à Bologne les 4-6 Novembre 1988, Mr Parajon-Collada, Directeur Général Adjoint de la CCE, présenta ce plan d'action et répondit aux remarques formulées par des collègues de divers pays européens.

Enfin, après une dernière concertation entre les collègues précités et le Bureau Exécutif de la AEIBS, la réponse de notre Association, dont vous trouverez le texte ci-après, a été envoyée à la CCE le 17 janvier 1989.

Espérons que nos suggestions puissent contribuer au succès de ce premier plan d'action pour les bibliothèques en Europe et que les bibliothèques biomédicales et de santé puissent participer d'emblée à cette coopération entre bibliothèques européennes.

1. FOREWORD

The European Association for Health Information and Libraries (EAHIL) very much appreciates that a Plan of Action for Libraries in the European Community has been drafted by the C.E.C. and presented last November at the Second European Conference of Medical Libraries by Mr Parajon-Collada, CEC Deputy Director General, who began a very open and fruitful exchange of ideas about this Plan.

As a new European library association, EAHIL also appreciates being asked by the CEC to comment on its draft Plan of Action and is very keen to offer its contribution for finalising and implementing this Plan of Action for Libraries in the European Community.

The general objectives of this plan, such as :

- promotion of library services throughout Europe taking into account geographic discrepancies in library provision,
 - rapid but orderly and cost-effective penetration of new technologies in libraries,
 - standardisation of bibliographic data,
 - harmonisation of library policies at all levels,
 - cooperation of libraries throughout Europe,
 - librarians' education and training,
- are fully in accordance with EAHIL aims and will be supported by EAHIL and its 500 members.

2. ACTION LINE 5 : "Exchange of experience and dissemination of knowledge".

This action line "fostering international attitudes and dialogue through professional exchanges, meetings and conferences" and "modernising the skills of library workers" is exactly what EAHIL has been doing since 1986 : this is EAHIL main objective.

Moreover, the modernisation of the skills of library workers is a prerequisite to library modernisation and to the implementation of this Plan of Action for Libraries.

A harmonised and more European education (including coordinated library visits, study tours, traineeships abroad...) and a greater mobility of library workers throughout Europe is essential for promoting library interconnection in Europe.

Thus, EAHIL fully supports the action line 5 which appears to be the most important and difficult part of this plan of action for libraries.

However, this action line 5 should be enlarged to the whole field of basic and continuing education of librarians, and to their status and their mobility throughout Europe.

In our view, the action line 5 should receive a much larger funding than the small part of the proposed budget of this draft Plan of Action.

3. ACTION LINE 3 : "innovative services".

This action line can produce spin-off effects and very tangible results indeed.

However, new technologies should also be adapted to library needs. For instance, libraries needs :

- "flat bed" telefax enabling people to copy documents directly from the documents themselves rather than from photocopies of those documents,
- common formats and protocols for teleordering documents by any electronic mail between libraries,
- "Juke-boxes" for CD-ROM and access to CD-ROM by local area networks.

Existing and new technologies should also be evaluated in regard to the library needs so that, before choosing any system, librarians could use evaluations and experiences of colleagues, like in any consumer association.

The "filtering mechanism" of the projects to be proposed in this action line could be at national level, but such a European plan of action for libraries should not prevent a similar "filtering mechanism" at European level, particularly in the case of specialised library associations.

4. ACTION LINE 2 : "international linking of systems".

This would indeed find an area of application in systems serving libraries and users in specific subject areas (e.g. in biomedical sciences). Such interconnections linking key libraries and cooperatives of libraries in one country with those in others will support many functions, including document delivery, and they will serve a high percentage of the information needs.

5. ACTION LINE 1 : "Library source data projects".

The first action line of this European plan receives most of the proposed budget, but it is supporting retrospective conversion of older books, national bibliographies and national union catalogues which are :

- national rather than European structures,
- usually not very efficient tools and not much used.

For instance, about 90 % of the interlibrary requests are for recent articles of journals, for which retrospective conversion, national bibliographies and union catalogues of books are useless.

Although standardisation of bibliographic data is highly desirable for national bibliographies, union catalogues and retrospective conversion, those proposed targets seem less short term and tangible projects than, for instance, the production of a European union catalogue of current journals which could be cheap, easy and quick, and whose usefulness and spin-off effect would be immediate and important for most of the libraries and end users in Europe.

6. REGIONAL DISCREPANCIES

The huge regional discrepancies in library funding is a major problem in library cooperation and especially for promoting new technologies in libraries of different European countries.

In any library network, the demand will be attracted by the libraries having the biggest purchasing power, and this could leave the weakest libraries in very dangerous position.

Moreover, less well-paid librarians, mostly unfamiliar with foreign languages and new technologies, are less likely to adopt them and so the benefit of this plan of action will mostly go to libraries whose staff is better paid.

For avoiding such unbalanced development, a special attention should be given to weak libraries when accepting projects for all action lines, and a parallel action should harmonize the purchasing powers of libraries and the skills of library workers in different European regions.

7. COUNTRIES OUTSIDE THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITY

Despite this "draft Plan of Action for libraries in the EC" has been prepared for libraries of the 12 Member States, it suggests (in p.5) that library cooperation should be enlarged to other countries.

EAHIL fully supports this view : for instance, the great experience of Nordic and Swiss libraries in new technologies and cooperation would be very useful to libraries of the 12 Member States.

Moreover, library cooperation throughout Europe would obviously be of mutual interest.

Thus, EAHIL strongly supports the acceptance in the projects adopted of libraries of European non-EC countries asking to participate and able to fund the cost of their participation.

8. REPRESENTATION

Last but not least, as a new and already large European library association, EAHL suggests the promotion of libraries and information services at European level not only through the national library organisations, but also through European library associations. European library associations offer the best opportunity to manage direct contacts and cooperation between librarians and libraries in different European countries, and they are the most suitable representatives of librarians at European level.

Although national library associations obviously remain important, the role of European library associations should be promoted on the European library scene to encourage European librarians to adopt a more "European-minded" consciousness and attitude, and greater participation.

9. CONCLUSION

This first plan of action for libraries in the European Community is indeed a major issue for all libraries in Europe.

EAHL hopes its comments will be of help and is very keen to contribute to the successful implementation of the plan of action for libraries throughout Europe in the nearest future.

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NEWS FROM EUROPE

FRANCE

FOUDRE - Document Delivery through Electronic Networking

The NUMERIS network (formerly called RNIS = ISDN: Integrated Services Digitalized Network), having been opened recently by FRANCE TELECOM, thus allowing the high speed and high flow transfer of data, the availability of the FOUDRE device (FOURNiture de Documents sur Réseau Electronique = Document Delivery through Electronic Networking) will take place next October 1989.

In order to fulfill the needs of academic teaching and research, FOUDRE will initiate additional modernization and optimisation of the present ILL network, essentially for scientific and technical, and notably biomedical, periodicals. The SUNIST (National Academic Host for Scientific and Technical Information) will serve for this action.

FOUDRE will be an open system, offering access to every digitalized documents source : CD-ROM or DON. Digitalisation will be done on demand, then registered into the internal "data base" of the system, listing every digitalised periodicals. Later requests for already digitalised documents registered within this file will be automatically routed to a digitalising library, whatever their former destination address. The request will then be processed in a totally automatic way without any physical handling.

FOUDRE implements thus the following functions:

FOUDRE - FOurniture de Documents sur Réseau Electronique

A la suite de l'ouverture de NUMERIS (ex RNIS), réseau numérique à intégration de services, permettant la transmission rapide de données à haut débit, que vient d'inaugurer FRANCE TELECOM, la mise en place d'un dispositif de FOurniture de Documents sur Réseau Electronique (FOUDRE) doit se faire en Octobre 1989.

Afin de répondre aux besoins de l'enseignement supérieur et de la recherche, FOUDRE permettra de moderniser et d'optimiser le réseau actuel de prêt de documents entre bibliothèques essentiellement pour les périodiques scientifiques et techniques, donc dans le domaine médical. Pour cela, on utilisera les services du SUNIST (Serveur Universitaire National Scientifique et Technique).

FOUDRE sera une structure ouverte qui offrira l'accès à tous les réservoirs de documents numérisés (CD-ROM ou DON), la numérisation étant effectuée à la demande, puis enregistrée dans la "banque de données" interne au système recensant les articles de périodiques numérisés. Chaque demande ultérieure d'un document enregistré dans cette banque de données sera automatiquement envoyée (quelle qu'ait été la destination première de la demande) à la bibliothèque ayant déjà numérisé le document, et la demande sera gérée de manière totalement automatique, sans aucune intervention manuelle. FOUDRE assure donc les fonctions

gateways with the present French ILL system (called PEB), with transmission of data to the SUNIST through electronic messaging, document digitalisation, document storage and retrieval, document transfer to the requesting libraries via NUMERIS, document reception and printing on a laser printer or on a Group IV telefax, statistics and invoicing. The French Copyright Center will be associated with this project so that a global agreement might be defined with the publishers involved, when document delivery through NUMERIS gets widely spread in the country.

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A New Database: Toxibase

Toxibase (national network of pharmacodependence documentation) is a database devoted not only to conventional drugs as heroin or marijuana, but also to all products inducing a physical or psychic dependence. Its aim is to cover all the facets of drug addiction, consequently it covers medical as well as sociological literature. Toxibase is made up of many data banks, the first one is bibliographic. In the next future, it will be completed by the addition of other bases, with research in progress, audiovisual material, legal texts.

With the support of the Health Ministry, the database is maintained by a network of 5 centers working in close collaboration: the abstracts of articles cited in Toxibase are written by the members of these centres, physicians or psychologists, actively working in the field of pharmacodependence. Micro Brs is used for access to Toxibase which can be questioned in French or English language owing to translation of titles and descriptors. Cooperation with some European countries is in way of implementation.

Toxibase (Réseau National de Documentation sur les Pharmacodépendances) est une banque de données non seulement consacrée aux drogues conventionnelles comme l'héroïne ou la marijuana, mais aussi à tous produits causant une dépendance physique ou psychique. Son but est de couvrir toutes les facettes de la toxicomanie. Par conséquent, elle comprend la littérature médicale et sociologique. Toxibase est faite de plusieurs banques de données, la première étant bibliographique. Dans un proche avenir, elle sera complétée d'autres banques de données telles que progrès de la recherche, matériel audio-visuel, textes légaux, etc.

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Les bibliothèques universitaires à l'heure du CD-ROM

Le Ministère de l'Education Nationale, de la Jeunesse et des Sports a engagé depuis plusieurs années une politique de modernisation des bibliothèques universitaires qui s'appuie sur l'intégration des nouveaux supports de l'information et de la communication. Il poursuit l'implantation d'équipements de lecture de mémoires optiques, et particulièrement de CD-ROM. Au cours de l'année 1988, 70 bibliothèques ont été équipées de stations complètes: microordinateurs, imprimantes et lecteurs de CD-ROM. Le programme d'équipement prévoit que toutes les sections des bibliothèques universitaires françaises, soit 180 unités dans les domaines de la médecine, de la pharmacie, du droit et des lettres, mettent à la disposition des étudiants, des enseignants et des chercheurs, une station de lecture de CD-ROM, d'ici la fin de l'année 1989.

L'AUPELF (Association des Université Partiellement ou Entièrement de Langue Française) et l'UREF (Université des Réseaux d'Expression Française), organisent avec l'Université des Sciences et Techniques du LangUEDOC, les IVèmes Journées Internationales de Technologie, à Montpellier, du 24 au 28 avril 1989.

The regular Annual Meeting of the "Arbeitsgemeinschaft für Medizinisches Bibliothekswesen" was held in Tübingen on October 25-26 1988.

The main topics of this year were the evaluation of "MeSH" (Medical Subject Headings) and "RSWK" - Subject Headings as subject cataloguing systems for medical libraries and reports on the use and acceptance of bibliographies on CD-ROM by library users.

The University Library of Tübingen presented itself and its special user-services and Dr. Wankmüller (also Organiser of this Meeting) gave a well acknowledged lecture on Tübingen history as a place of publishers of chemical and pharmaceutical journals.

The Meeting ended with the annual reports of the Central Library of Medicine (ZBM, Köln) and DIMDI.

The subgroup of Hospital Librarians also gathered again to discuss special hospital library related topics.

During the membership Meeting of the "Arbeitsgemeinschaft" the German Member of the EAHIL Council, Ms Jutta Heller, was presented to the attendants.

SCOTLAND

Medical Education and the Edinburgh Declaration*

The World Federation for Medical Education closely associated with WHO, held in August 1988 a World Conference on Medical Education.

This Conference was the culmination of a series of national and regional meetings. These meetings were held to review the situation of medical education and to formulate strategies for improving its social relevance and efficiency.

The report of the Conference includes strategies for introducing the required changes in medical education, as well as a plan of action at global, regional and national levels.

It also includes the "Edinburgh Declaration" which provides the essentials of the recommendations of the Conference. The Declaration says that the aim of medical education is to produce doctors who will promote the health of all people, and that aim is not being realized in many places, despite the enormous progress that has been made during this century in the biomedical sciences.

Scientific research continues to bring rich rewards, but man needs more than science alone. It is the health needs of the human race as a whole, and the whole person, that medical educators must affirm.

Many improvements can be achieved by actions within the medical school itself. Reform on medical education requires more than agreement. It requires a widespread commitment to action, vigorous leadership and political will, in some settings also financial support.

Medical educators have a long and weary path to tread, and we, as medical librarians, can help them to reach the goal.

Education Médicale et Déclaration d'Edimbourg*

La Fédération Mondiale pour l'Education Médicale, étroitement associée à l'OMS, a tenu les 7-12 août 1988 une Conférence Mondiale sur l'Education Médicale. Cette Conférence était le point culminant d'une série de réunions régionales et nationales. Ces réunions avaient pour but de revoir la situation de l'éducation médicale et de formuler la stratégie pour améliorer son efficacité et son importance sociale. Le rapport de cette Conférence comprend les stratégies pour introduire les changements requis en éducation médicale, ainsi qu'un plan d'action au niveau global, régional et national. Il comprend également la "Déclaration d'Edimbourg" qui donne l'essentiel des recommandations de la Conférence.

La Déclaration stipule que le but de l'éducation médicale est de former des médecins qui veilleront à maintenir la santé de tous les peuples. On ne peut pas encore poursuivre ce but dans de nombreuses régions du globe, malgré les progrès énormes qui ont été réalisés en sciences médicales au cours de ce siècle.

La recherche scientifique continue à produire des résultats enrichissants mais l'homme a besoin de plus que la science seule. Les éducateurs médicaux doivent veiller aux besoins de santé de la race humaine, globalement, et à ceux de la personne humaine toute entière. Beaucoup d'améliorations peuvent être réalisées au sein même de l'enseignement médical. La réforme médicale demande plus que des accords. Elle exige un engagement à tous les niveaux, une direction énergique ainsi qu'un soutien financier.

NEWS ON THESAURUS WORK

Thesauri on the Bases of MeSH

During the Second European Conference of Medical Libraries held in Bologna last November, the question of thesauri on the basis of MeSH, came into focus. Therefore, we have asked Dr Fernando Rodriguez Alonso, Director, BIREME, Centro Latino-American y del Caribe de Informacion en Ciencias de la Salud, Sao Paulo, Brazil, to give an introduction into the work that has been done in BIREME.

It is the first report on the subject which we publish in the EAHIL Newsletter. Documentation centres and libraries in different countries with different working languages are engaged in systematically expanding the NLM thesaurus in fields related to medicine and health by keeping within the structure of MeSH. We encourage colleagues to bring their activities in this field to the attention of Newsletter readers and, in particular, of those who in Bologna expressed their interest in contacts among such centres.

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DeCS - Descriptores en Ciencias de la Salud (Descriptors in Health Literature)

DeCS - Descriptores en Ciencias de la Salud (Descriptors in Health Sciences) is the controlled vocabulary used for indexing and searching documents in LILACS (Latin American and Caribbean Health Literature) database. Based on MeSH, it shows the same hierarchical structure bringing together the near 15,000 terms in the same categories as in MeSH.

DeCS cannot be considered as a literal translation of MeSH. Although most of the MeSH terms were translated into Spanish and Portuguese, a good number of new terms were added mostly in Public Health subjects. These terms are grouped in a new category called SP - Salud Publica (Public Health) together with those MeSH terms dealing with Public Health. The SP category is divided in six subcategories:

- SP1 Health Planning and Administration
- SP2 Health Care
- SP3 Demography
- SP4 Environmental Health
- SP5 Epidemiology and Biostatistics
- SP6 Nutrition

A group of health librarians and Public Health specialists was engaged in the preparation of the SP category and, is also taking care of the continuous updating of DeCS.

Each version of DeCS, Spanish or Portuguese, includes two volumes - Alphabetic List and Hierarchical List - and is available at US\$60.00 (US\$50.00 for Spain and Portugal) including airmail freight.

By 1992 there will only be 284,000 CD-ROM drives installed in Europe. This compares with the estimated 30 million personal computers then in use. This pessimistic forecast for the CD-ROM market comes from Link resources in a recent report, "Market opportunities for CD-ROM in Europe 1987-1992". By 1992 Germany will have overtaken Italy as the largest market for CD-ROMs with an installed based of 60,000 drives. Over the next five years 17 million discs will be pressed in Europe. A recent estimate by Julie Schwerin of InfoTech puts the world installed base of drives at 78,750 in 1988. CD-ROMs in DOS environment, some factors you should think about

When installing CD-ROM equipment, there are a lot of things that can go wrong and they very often do. After having worked with CD-ROM the last 1 1/2 year and having tested different databases on IBM PC XT/AT and PS-2/30 and so I do have some hints to give you.

These are the main points you should think about before installing CD-ROM databases in an IBM or IBM compatible PC-environment:

The PC

Internal memory : 640 kbyte with at least 510-530 kbyte of free memory
 Hard disk : It is most convenient to have one 10-20 Mbyte

CD-ROM DRIVE

Recommendation : Should be produced after the High Sierra Standard
 Be aware of : that the drive you are going to buy is working on your PC and that the producer has the correct interface card and installation software for your PC.

The CD-ROM

It is produced after the High Sierra Standard. Does it have its own driver software or does it work under MSCDEX (Micro-Soft-Compact-Disc-Extensions)? If it has its own driver software, does it in the programme have a file with the correct configuration (normally a config.sys file) for your CD-ROM driver? What are the limitations for internal memory and free space on the hard-disk for running the CD-ROM?

AT LAST

At last you should know how to use a screwdriver and know as much as possible about the DOS oprating system (commands, etc.). You normally must put some commands in the autoexec.bat and config.sys files that install the software and configurate the system for the CD-ROMs you are going to use. Don't sign any contract before you have seen the equipment in use!!
